## Preparing for successful partnership...

- Remember the importance of dependability. Your partnership furthers the work of your agency and they are counting on you.
- Uphold agency policies, procedures and confidentiality.
- Get support from Redding LIFE: ask questions, request help, enjoy Redding LIFE gatherings for community connection.
- Consider asking God how He wants to bless your agency - pray, declare, expect.
- Ask questions and seek to understand. Offer suggestions only when invited.
- Share positive stories that you hear about our city, big and small!
- Arrive prepared to serve, set aside personal issues as much as possible.
- Be encouraging - look for God's beautiful craftsmanship in the people around you.
- When you commit to an on-going position, give your agency supervisor ample notice if your availability changes or you would like to change your involvement. (1-2 months is recommended)

While these points might sound like common sense, it's important to us that you feel supported, at ease, and solidly prepared to succeed in your volunteer partnership.
